A free application for federal student aid

A free application for some types of Oklahoma aid

Required for *Oklahoma's Promise*

The key to unlocking money for college

A statement of your family's income from a prior year

A college application

A student loan application

Available only to students with great grades

A commitment to accept any type of financial aid

A credit check

Federal financial aid is available at many types of schools: career technology centers, community colleges, universities and graduate schools.

Federal student aid includes financial assistance from three different sources: grants, work-study jobs and low-interest student loans.

You do ***not*** have to report your grade point average (GPA).

While there are some basic requirements to be eligible for federal student aid, your age and ethnicity are ***not*** considered.

Scholarships come from other sources and need to be applied for separately.

The FAFSA isn't a one-time thing. You'll need to submit one each year you need money for college.
